2.0 Guest speaker:

2.1 Tim Spencer, P&C Federation North West Sydney, Councillor Provided a PPT presentation with an update on the current status of the P&C Federation. Included an explanation of the Department of Education Restructure. Discussed Gonski Report issues – please see appendix 1 for summary slides of this issue.

Other points made:

- Current federation is a newly formed federation after the old one was disbanded 12 months ago. A new constitution was introduced. There are 16 members on the board now. 7 councillors of 16 are part of the executive.
- Just had their AGM and passed 10 motions. Some of which were regarding; SEE indication on enrolment forms; Central principles for outlying schools; P&C support – re-doing guidance documentation and offering a more electronic based system; WHS and HR matters assistance; Offering legal services;

8. Band - Warwick Edwards

- All bands received silver awards in the University of NSW band festival.
- Bunnings cake stall made just under \$1000
- Have completed assessment of instruments. Based on achieving a similar intake of students in training band as per this year will require between \$10000 and \$17000 for new instruments for next year. Will know exact numbers once expressions of interest have been received for next year in midterm 4. Due to the band camp making a profit, better than expected fundraising (plus what we hope to make from the cake stall at the movie night) and some cutting back on other expenses the band currently expects to be able to contribute around \$9k for new instruments. There will also be a couple of thousand in the instrument fees account. The school has advised it can also help out if required.

 - 16th October Instrument try out morning
 - 27th October Parent's information evening
- The committee is investigating the viability of starting a wind ensemble as an audition only extension ensemble for instruments not part of Funk Band.

 All rehearsals are either just prior or just after school (we currently have Funk Band students hanging around school waiting for Training band to finish in the afternoons). Hope to publish in the next week.

Funding and Expenditure to date

- Federal government now refusing to guarantee last 2 years

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
