7.3 **Uniform shop** – nothing to report other than Nikki Honeysett reports its been a very quiet term.

7.4 Canteen – Karen Edwards

The new freezer is in and working well the very large old freezer was removed and disposed of by the cheery delivery guys from Holman's they had to do a fair amount of moving things around and taking bits off to fit through doorways etc.

We need to make a decision re the selling of flavored waters in the canteen. Since before I started here we have sold focus waters which are flavored with juice and contain fructose and preservatives. With the new guidelines these will not fit into the criteria. The manufacturer has come up with a replacement product which is sweetened with stevia and this is now replacing the other product

I feel that perhaps we should take this opportunity to stop offering flavoured waters perhaps only offer flavoured milk (which is ok under the new guidelines) plain water and juices which

are 99% juice as we currently offer. An option that has been suggested is to invest in a water filter station where students can fill their own 'keep' water bottles with water. Thus encouraging healthier drink choices and reinforcing the no waste principles.

We currently sell about the same number of focus waters each week as flavoured milks each being 40% of drink sales and juices account for 20%

We sell very little plain unflavoured water at this point

Canteens are being urged to start implementing the new strategies now and not wait till 2019.

With regard to frozen items I have been encouraging the smaller students to not chose TNTs which will not be acceptable under the new guidelines instead to opt for frozen juice cups (99% juice no added sugar) and juices and Quelch ice blocks (also 99% juice)

We could and should probably phase TNTs out by the end of the coming summer

Voting:

Karen proposed phasing out of flavoured water all in agreement at meeting to not offer flavoured waters – only flavoured milk.

Veryan requested approval for qualified electrician to do wiring required for air con in Canteen . Julie Tanger seconded – unanimously passed

7.5 MDFDGG

This year's Father's Day Breakfast was a huge success. It was a 6am start for the committee and a few keen volunteers. This year the format was changed from 3 x 30min sessions to 2 x 45min sessions. We still had 450 people over the 2 sessions which made the sessions very busy but it all ran smoothly. I wanted to say a big "Thank You" to all of our wonderful volunteers on the day. The day would not have been possible without our volunteers Craig Hobson, Veryan McAllister, Virginia Fox, Berenice Ferguson, Christine Cunningham, Vanessa Oliveri, Jack Oliveri, Craig Wilson, Michelle Koo, Kim Curby, Alex Ryan, Ann-Katherine Mantere, Meaghan Tchepak, Julie Tanger, Ainslie Jennings and Murray Dicks and Lachlan Wilson. We took \$807.90 on the day and made \$3386 on tickets. We are yet to get a final figure as expenses are still coming in for food, gas and other misc. items.

We've learnt a few ideas to make it run more smoothly next year including starting to cook sooner. There were no real issues on the day and we had juice, bacon, eggs and rolls left over. Band will buy the eggs and bacon from us for the election BBQ.

The Mothers Day Fathers Day Gift Group has been made up with 4 new members this year who have done an amazing job throughout the year and dedicated many hours to the Mother's Day stall and Father's Day Breakfast. I want to say a huge thank you to the new members Deb Flanagan, Shannon Curran, Anna Hobson and Therese Neville. We have had a successful year and I look forward to working with them all again next year!
