#### 2.2 Treasurer – Martina Miller

Treasurers Report for AGM 20.03.18

- Audit completed and copies of financial statements for 2017 have been distributed. Auditors appear satisfied with the levels of control in place for the P&C.
- All P&C activities for the 2017 year operated at a loss of \$35k. We contributed a total of \$118K to the school.
- We have \$64k in a Term deposit for use at the P&C's discretion

### 2.3 Uniform Shop – Nicky Honeysett

#### 2017 Overview

The start of Term 1 is always a busy time for the Uniform Shop, and 2017 was no exception with a record 25 new families requiring uniform fittings during the first week of term.

Secure storage in the Shop continued to prove challenging due to the increased levels of stock held during the peak periods. The P&C approved our Term 1 funding request for an additional lockable cupboard, but with careful planning and some canny reorganising, we have so far managed to avoid the need to purchase this.

After the untimely and tragic demise of the Shop Lap-Top during Term 1, we took the opportunity to conduct a review of our systems, and how we track and capture sales/stock information. The need to replace the PoS system was long overdue and we began the lengthy process of evaluating alternatives. Although there are some very good cloud-based options available, ultimately we have held back on making a final recommendation as none of the shortlisted systems completely meet our needs. Further discussion will be needed to agree the way forward.

In the interim period, we set up comprehensive excel spreadsheets that are used to track stock inventory and stock control, which are working well, if not better, than the old PoS system used. All Uniform Shop files are now kept on Dropbox to minimise the risk of lost data.

The Skort evaluation trial period ended during Term 1. Twelve students (and their parents') participated in the trial. Feedback was collated based on a pre-defined criteria and this enabled us to identify the best skort based on quality and cost. The new skort was introduced as part of the summer uniform at the end of Term 3 2017.

During our annual uniform review, a sizing issue on Winter Tunics was identified. This was raised with the Supplier concerned and we worked with them to ensure new stock of tunics will conform to a standardised sizing, which applies to both the TWPS Summer dress and Winter Tunic.

Uniform fittings commenced in October for new students starting TWPS in 2018 and thankfully a repeat of the 'Great 2017 Kindy Intake' did not happen. The Uniform Fitting process was amended to include the fitting of both summer and winter uniforms, which avoids the need to conduct additional winter fittings for Kindy students in March/April.

## Other changes during 2017:

- Our first pricing increase in five years', unfortunately due to increases in manufacturing costs being passed on by our Suppliers.
- A small sizing increase was made to the embroidered school logo on our sport polo top, shirts and blouses to improvement clarity of the design.
- A 10c bag charge was introduced to cover the cost of the brown paper bags used for Flexischools and Shop purchases.
- The development of a recycling plan for the Shop: all soft plastics are now collected and taken to the Sefton Road Recycling Plant. All cardboard and waste paper are also recycled. We continue to work with our Suppliers to cut down and eliminate un-necessary packaging on uniform items we purchase.

We are very lucky to have some amazing volunteers in the Shop, and my thanks to those individuals: Carolyn Delapierre, Rebecca Pinckney, Berenice Ferguson, Kerith Massey, Trish Bell, Michelle Lee and Michelle Koo.

A special acknowledgment must be given to Lisa Pang, who is a key member of the team and has worked alongside me for the past four years'.

Our commitment to providing a cost-effective and quality uniform sits equally alongside that of providing excellent customer service, and these values continue to underpin everything we do in the Shop.

In conclusion, 2017 was an interesting year that threw us a few unexpected obstacles that certainly proved challenging to work around. Thankfully, we were able to proactively tackle these without disrupting service to our customers'.

#### MDFDGG Report for AGM 2018 re 2017

The group started the year with four new members Anna, Therese, Deb and Shannon with only two remaining members from previous years, Vicky Galante who left part way through the year due to work commitments and Bel Wilson who was convenor for the year.

We met on a weekly basis and spent the first part of the year sourcing and pricing and packaging stock. The Mother's Day stall was held in May and was a successfully run event where we ended up selling around 1,500 gifts which were wrapped by our lovely group of volunteers. We served close to 600 students throughout the day. The stall ran well however we did have a large amount of leftover stock, some of which we were able to sell at the P&C stall later in the year. We did over estimate the amount of gifts that would be purchased per child and feel we could do a better job of promoting the different items we available have SO we will focus on this aspect in 2018.

In September we ran a Father's Day breakfast before school. This was a very hectic week as most of us had been heavily involved in Spring Fair and with only six days between the two events we were very busy. Based on feedback we made several changes from previous years. Firstly we changed the format of the breakfast from three sessions of 30 minutes to 2 sessions of 45 minutes giving families more time together. We also simplified the menu, offered gluten free items and we had a student from Pennant Hills High School playing the piano during event. We also ran a small stall outside the hall. The breakfast ran very well with positive feedback received. We managed to feed 450 people breakfast over 90 minutes and the breakfast was a sell-out.

Our biggest challenge for the year was that most of us were new to the group, we had a few minor issues on the day with both events but we are aware of them and they will be addressed going forward in 2018.

The group would like to extend a huge thank you to the P&C for their support and to all of the amazing parents that have helped with both events throughout the year. We had approximately 20 volunteers at the Mother's Day stall that came in and very patiently wrapped over 1500 presents throughout the day. The Father's Day breakfast was an early start at 530am on Friday morning so again a huge thank you to the amazing parents that came in in the early hours of the morning and helped throughout the day. These events would not be possible without the continual support of our volunteers and also the support of students and families attending these events. 2017 was the a big learning curve for most of us in the group but we've all remained on board for 2018 and hopefully this year will be a little bit easier as well have a better idea of what we're doing.

During 2017 we had around 100 students in our program and we have in excess of 130 students as we start 2018.

2017 has been a good year for TWPS Band this year, our competition results have been solid with:

- Gold awards to the Training and Junior and Silver for Senior and Stage bands at the UNSW school band festival.
- At Hornsby North Band Festival Distinctions were awarded to Training and Stage Bands with Credits for Junior and Senior Bands.

Particularly pleasing this year was the successful audition of the Stage Band to perform at the Arts Alive Primary Choral Concerts in the Town Hall. Stage Band is the youngest Stage Band we've had for a few years with several members from year 4. Stage Band represented the school magnificently at the Kakadu Concert in September, a credit to all of them and a memorable night out.

Other performances during the year at Grandparents Day, Education week, Band/Bear Day, Award and presentations days, various school assemblies, Spring Fair, the Cracker Night at Ruddock Park, Bunnings Warehouse and a combined local schools concert at Normanhurst West.

These working bees were essential for clearing out finished crops, tidying up and weeding ready for our students to continue to grow and learn from our garden.

At the November working Bee we had our inaugural 'Crop Swap" which was a lovely addition to our working bee activities.

The garden committee are very grateful for the contributions that many of our families give in their time and energy for the garden.

- Over the year we have grown beetroot, spinach, corn, sun-flowers, herbs, sweet potatoes, lettuce, snow-peas and much more. It is amazing how much we have produced.
- Unfortunately, late last year we had an episode of vandalism. Some well advanced corn and sunflowers were destroyed. It is so very sad when this sort of thing happens. But we must rise above it, use it to help our kids learn that not everyone does the right thing, and that when it happens, we pick ourselves up, dust off, and try again. We hope this was an isolated incident.
- We also implemented a watering roster over the holidays during the year and summer which worked very well and ensured survival of the crops over the breaks.
- The garden Plant Stall at the 2017 Spring Fair was a huge success managed by Kindy Blue with help from the garden committee, particularly Ingrid Leese. Thank you also to the nurseries and businesses which donated plants and produce to sell at the Plant Stall - Mint Fresh IGA, Hornsby Council Community Nursery, Plant Bug Garden Centre at Mt Colah, Eden Gardens and Martina Miller and Alpine Nurseries. We really appreciated their support and generosity.
- We still have more to do. The garden committee would like to proceed with plans to build a sensory garden. This idea was put on hold due to other priorities, but we feel that this year is the time to get it moving again. Watch this space.
