2.1 Jane is really pleased to be at the school as a local Mum with two kids at Normanhurst West Public School (NWPS) she has been canteen convenor at NWPS for the last 7 years. Jane spoke about the menu - there should only be 8 "occasional items" but instead there are 23 items on our current menu so there will need to be changes to the menu to fit in with the healthy guidelines. 6.1 Mother's Day Breakfast Proposal - Update & Report

- 6.1.1 Mel Barter confirmed 411 people attend both the sessions and the 8am sold out. They have made \$1879 profit thanks to quite a few donations that came at the end. Select Fresh, Woolworths, Jolly Green Grocer and Sydney Biopackaging were the food and utensil donors to the Breakfast.
- 6.1.2 They also received \$1100 of donated prizes from School Mums and other local business. So in total they had \$2,182 of donations. 33 volunteers of which 18 were Dads. They have sent out a survey to all attend which 55% of people respond and satisfaction was high and many positive comments. There were some learnings they will share in their full report. They also had positive comments about the band.

- 6.1.4 Emma Fenton wanted to highlight a number of the attendees were grandmothers, Aunts etc and it had a real community feel.

MATT KEAN GRANT: Last December we were awarded \$18k from the Matt Kean MP Grant for 2017. Originally the grant was to be used to refurbish the Hall. Unfort Assets advised that they could not approve such refurbishments because of ongoing maintenance. We then had to apply for the grant to be reallocated for another item. I am pleased to announce that the past months the P&C have been working hard to get this over the line and I was advised last week that our application to use the grant money for artificial grass in the 'dirt' area between the office and the library was approved. Money has been rec'd into our account and the office is now making arrangements for that upgrade to happen ASAP. This will be a fantastic area for students to use during lunch time. Previously unusable. COLOUR RUN PRIZES – have now arrived. All 20 huge boxes of them!! Because of School Holidays there was a small delay from the warehouse -I now need to go thru these boxes and distribute. An email will be going out this week to Class Parents to ask for some helpers for prize packing next week – if you have a spare hour or so please come by the Hall next week to help. If every class can get 2 or 3 parents to help they should be packed and back to students within a few hours. All details will be up on FB. I am very keen to get prizes out to students and close off this event. I am aware we have had a lot of Volunteering this past week so thank you for your consideration.

TWPS COOK BOOKS: A big shout out to Julie Tanger & Vanessa Oliveri who have done some extraordinary selling of the Cook Books these past few weeks. They have managed to sell 53 books via Westleigh Village and setting up a stall at school at pick up. The MDFDGG agreed to place the book available for sale for the gift stall and they sold 27 books.  - 9.3.1 A short report this month as nothing much to report on. It's been a quieter than usual start to the new term in the Shop. Online orders have increased over the last week as the temperature finally starts to drop and parents begin to think about Winter Uniform.

9.6 Band – Robin Beard

9.6.1 Over the past few years, Band have created a set of work sheets to help our students and their tutors. These sheets work with the 'text' book and set out where a student might expect to be up to each term. In order to encourage the students to complete the sheets (and thus practice ad improve), we're putting together some band awards which will be presented in Band rehearsals when the worksheets are completed.

Exciting news that our Stage Band were selected (via audition) to play at the Arts Unit of NSW Acacia Concert at the Opera House later this month (May 20th). The Festival of Instrumental Music features musically diverse performances from more than 1000 public school students in Combined Recorders and String Ensembles, supported by individual items from **exceptionally talented** vocalists, instrumental soloists and ensembles. Stage Band enjoyed playing at the Mothers Day Breakfast last week and Training Band were thrilled to perform at a recent assembly; Junior Band will be playing soon. Band Camp is about to happen (May 24-25th). Final numbers being confirmed. Would like to thank Yvonne Curren who has put everything together this year for us, we're looking forward to a fun couple of days with tutors, a guest conductor and activities ready to roll.

9.7 Green Thumb – Patty Correll

9.7.1 The first working bee of the year was held on Saturday 24th February. The Garden Beds were cleared and compost added in preparation for Autumn Plantings. Thank you to the volunteers who gave up their Saturday morning to help us in the garden.

We have introduced a new system to help Mrs Susan Liddle coordinate planting in the school garden this year. We are unable to attend to plant with every class, so we have provided the teachers with a Garden Planting Kit. This includes a planting guide/map of the school garden, instructions and envelopes with seeds to plant. Classes have now begun planting with the new kit. We will monitor progress of the Autumn Crops and assess whether any changes need to be made.

We have restarted Garden Club on Tuesdays at lunchtime in the school garden. This is run by a group of Green Thumbs volunteers for the students. We coordinate volunteers via our Green Thumbs Facebook Group, which is a closed group for Parents and Teachers of the school community. We encourage anyone interested in the School Garden to join this group. We are very lucky to have a group of dedicated volunteers to help us run Garden Club, which gives students a safe place at lunchtime, away from the busy playground/oval. Last Tuesday the garden beds were watered, weeded and one garden bed was planted with broccoli and cauliflower seedlings generously donated by Julie Tanger. We identified that many of the watering cans are missing or broken. We will look into purchasing new watering cans for the garden that are made of metal and hopefully longer lasting than plastic.

After discussions with Mrs Chantal Mamo, we have organised a small working bee on Friday 18th May from 9.30am. We will clean up the courtyard in the middle of the school office building, where the outdoor kitchen is now located. We will dig out the old soil in pots already in the courtyard and refresh with new potting mix as well as giving the area a general tidy up. We will plant snow peas to grow on the wire trellis already in place, so the students can use the snow peas in their cooking activities. Longer term we hope to set up a vertical herb garden that the students can help grow and use the produce in cooking.

10. Agenda Items

- 10.1 Vote for Assistant Secretary
 - 10.1.1 Amanda nominate Michelle Gardiner and Emma Fenton seconded. It was passed unanimously
- **10.2** 2018 Budget Draft Discussion and Approval Vote
 - 10.2.1 Susie Parry confirmed Martina Miller and Vanessa Erickson have spoken extensively about the draft budget.

- 10.2.2 Matt Dalziel has confirmed the stage 1 of the PA system is up and running and working very well and full operational. A few issues they have struck is including that they have no zone control so the microphone goes through the entire school everytime. They are installing a zone control to fix that for now. The second part is improving the speakers in the outside area to do better music throughout the school and also do some of the classrooms. The important aspect of the second phase would mean at Spring Fair they could use it to announce events during the day and advertise silent auction etc. The \$9,000 quote could be split but would not be as good. This second stage is critical to what we are doing with the new system and would be welcomed
- 10.2.3 Martina has prepared a draft budget see Appendix 1.
- 10.2.4 Martina has said that budget looks bad but she has put everything that everyone has requested in the budget and has set the income on the lower side. She has also put all the expenses we pay each year. So we can we can make an informed decision on Mrs Mamo's wish list.
- 10.2.5 Martina discussed the 30 laptops which Mrs Mamo would like which was to be paid for by the Colour Run, the requests she has for new technology, she has plans for the new PA System and also discussed a request for Xero to change from our current accounting software. The change to Xero would cost \$450
- 10.2.6 She also discussed there are items on the budget which have been paid last year like the Big Ass fan and the telephone system. Also the Matt Kean grant which is being paid and work will be completed soon.
- 10.2.7 Martina discussed the expenses for the sub groups such as \$5,000 for band and \$3,500 for sensory system. Martina has adjusted the POS system cost for the Uniform shop from \$5,000 to \$1500 which is enough for buying a new laptop. Susie Parry confirmed the Uniform shop needs a new laptop and they could do the stocktake through Xero, if passed. Martina also confirmed the Road Safety Signs which voted on at the last meeting which come in costs.
- 10.2.8 Emma wanted to confirm that the money for Mother's Day breakfast would be included in the budget.
- 10.2.9 Martina says if we agree to everything on here then we need to eat in on the term deposit. Mrs Mamo says having the term deposit is good but we may not need the full amount. She also confirmed she doesn't need everything on the list.
- 10.2.10 It was discussed the CARES program would work out to only be \$12 per student and it was suggested given the Year 6 students get the farewell money so they don't need this paid for.
- 10.2.11 It was discussed that teachers gifts are important as is the Learning Support Teacher Mrs Mamo confirmed this is vital to students who are struggling.
- 10.2.12 Mrs Mamo is keen to get the 30 laptops in the library and that is something she really wants off her list. She also confirmed the interactive TVs and air conditioning is important for learning
- 10.2.13 Susie Parry asked why the Department of Education isn't pay for interactive white boards. Mrs Mamo confirmed the Department gave the school \$20,000 for the support unit set up so this couldn't pay for additional whiteboards in the new classrooms. Also, the Department of Education won't pay for interactive white board they only provide furniture and air conditioning for demountable.

- 10.2.14 Martina Miller confirmed that the P&C have made a commitment to 4 interactive white boards a year in the budget.
- 10.2.15 Mrs Mamo suggested that she will pay for 1B air conditioning, the still cameras, the green screen can be looked at next year and she would pay \$5,000 for the PA system.

- 10.2.25 It was decided that we would put a hold on green screen and still cameras
- 10.2.26 PA System Mrs Mamo has confirmed \$5,000 the school would pay She confirmed with communication with the kids is important so she feels it is essential. It was proposed by Matt Dalziel that \$5,000 would be paid from P&C and Martina Miller seconded and was passed unanimously
- 10.2.27 5 cent drive was proposed by Emma Fenton and Janine Sherlock seconded the motion and it was passed unanimously.
- 10.2.28 \$5,000 Contingency Martina MIller to look at term deposit to be used as contingency and discuss at next meeting
- 10.2.29 Green Thumbs \$3,500 Sensory Garden was proposed by Ingrid Leese and seconded by Martina Miller but it was discussed that it would be reviewed throughout the year
- 10.2.30 Joanne McAdam and Simone Raison volunteered to do a mufti day
- 10.2.31 Xero Martina Miller proposed we purchased the Xero program and seconded by Robin and it was passed unanimously
- 10.2.32 Band Grant of \$5,000 was proposed by Kate McGettigan and Mel Barter seconded and it was passed unanimously.
- 10.2.33 Laptop for the Uniform Shop with the view to installing Xero for stocktake was proposed by Susie Parry and seconded by Julie Tanger and passed unanimously.
