





	Action: Chantal will take this to the environment committee and see what suggestions they come up with. Fundraising 2020

Thank you - 2020 started off well with all students and teachers settled into teaching and learning. The power outage was challenging and we thank everyone for your amazing support.


The teachers appreciated the pizza lunch and a cold drink. I admire their resilience and team work during these conditions.





President's Report – 25th February 2020


Welcome to the 1st meeting of 2020 - a few weeks later than originally planned!





Load N Go Visa Card Policy

1. Background

TWPS P&C holds a post office Load N Go Visa card (refers as LNG card in the policy) since 2018. The card was primarily used to pay for the system subscription (eg. Xero). Since August 2019, considering the amount of cash that members had to put in for fundraising event, P&C started to actively manage LNG card for fundraising purpose.

2. Purpose & Scope

This policy outlines the requirements that apply to all transactions paid out of the LNG card.

3. Policy outline

3.1 Request for top up

Fund Raising teams work out the top up equipment based on guotes from vendors. The request will need to be send to P&C President for approval.

3.2 Top Up approved

P&C President approves and forwards the request to Treasury for top up.

3.3 Top Up Occurred & Card Picked up


Treasury transfers cash based on the top up request into LNG card. Fund Raising teams pick up the card from Treasury. Treasury will reconcile the top up transactions into LNG clearing account (11210).

3.4 Expenses Occurred

Fund Raising teams use the LNG card to pay for expenses relates to fundraising events.


3.5 Card Returned with Receipts / Invoices

The LNG card need to be returned to Treasury after the fund-raising events. Fund raising teams are required to send all receipts and invoices back to Treasury via email.



3.6 Reconciliation

Treasury reconciles all receipts and invoices with transactions downloaded from LNG card. Any unknown transactions will be followed up with fundraising team and P&C President. All known transactions will be cleared against the LNG clearing account (11210).

Canteen report for February P&C meeting




MDFDGG P & C Report – 25 February 2020

Instrument Handout day was held at the end of January and went smoothly. Thanks to our Instrument Co-ordinator Meghan Tchepak for putting everything together.




We have 4 beds cleared and ready for planting this term and the Mrs Liddle has the seed kits if any classes want to start gardening.

Dear councillors,

In November 2017 I wrote to you regarding a pedestrian crossing outside of the Thornleigh West Public School on Quarter Sessions road. I raised my concern about the number of inattentive drivers who were driving through the crossing without noticing pedestrians – either waiting at the crossing, or crossing at the time the drivers drove through.

I acknowledge and understand council's response, and your current funding issues, particularly during this bushfire crisis.

However, I have had enough and am not going to allow this to continue.

Throughout last year, I constantly approach drivers who had driven through the pedestrian crossing. Sometimes they drove through while I, often with my son at my side, waited for drivers to see us, but I also had drivers drive through while I was walking across the crossing.

I raised this matter with the school several times during 2017 and 2018 in writing to get them to mention this matter in their newsletter. The P and C (I believe) eventually put up a very large yellow sign for students to be vigilant at the entrance (which I think has since fallen off)

This morning I was crossing with my son, I was 1/3 of the way across the crossing, when an inattentive driver drove straight through. When I approached the person, they admitted to being focussed on where they were going to park, rather than the road and their surroundings.

This appears to be the reason why people drive right through the crossing without care.

Also this morning, I noticed several cars stopped in the no stopping zone just past the crossing – which demonstrates a lack of care and focus on the road at this school.

Late last year a driver was talking on his mobile phone while driving through the crossing – I was again 1/3 of the way across the crossing. When I approached this person, he seemed rather unconcerned, which demonstrates clearly what we are dealing with here.

This hazardous situation has to stop before someone is killed!!!

I understand that your research seems to suggest that that not enough people use that crossing. I understand your constraint. However, if one of our children is killed, will that be good enough proof to you that this is a dangerous crossing before you do something!

I apologise for my sarcasm, but I am VERY fearful that a death is likely on this crossing and this section of road, and something needs to be done about it as a matter of urgency.

... and nobody seems to be listening – hence my frustration.

Based on my conversations with other parents, this inattentive "near miss" is all too frequent, and we don't need a casualty!

I would appreciate another URGENT look at this crossing before someone is killed.

I will also be raising this with Minister Matt Kean, as this matter has gone on for too long. I also believe that this situation needs to be addressed from multiple angles.
