
2019 was certainly a busy year with many activities and achievements.

Thank you to each and every one of you for supporting these initiatives and events throughout the year.


In 2019 the P&C paid for and purchased:


Plus...Monetary support for TWPS Band Green Thumbs Wakakirri & Year 6 farewell Plus a per teacher class contribution

After the flooding in November 2018, the uniform shop had new lino flooring installed and we were able to move all our stock back into the shop and reopen for Term 2 2019.


During 2019

- I continued to implement the POS system and incorporated barcoding and scanning of products to ensure that we were able to have a more robust inventory control and ordering system for our stock.
- we changed the style of the sport skort to be more in line with the style and pricing of the unisex sport shorts, this has been well received. We also introduced knee high navy socks as a sales item for winter uniforms, although they are a unisex item, they were primarily introduced as an alternative to the tights for girls to wear
- After a raft of EFTPOS issues early in 2019, we were finally able to get a replacement unit which hasn't had the network connectivity issues that the previous unit did. This unit has remained stable to date.

A huge thank you to the P&C for assisting me and helping with the cashflow issues as well as supporting the change in process that had to be made this year. I would also like to thank Kate McGettigan, Anna Hobson, Shannon Curran and Julie Tanger for their assistance that they have provided.


### Appendix 4: Canteen Report

### Appendix 5: MDFDGG Report


The group started the year with the majority of our committee members returning (Anna Hobson, Therese Neville, Deb Flanagan, Shannon Curran, Kirsten Dicks, Janine Sherlock, Putu Barnett, Randa Kamand, and Vanessa Oliveri.) Janine Sherlock continued in the role of convenor with Shannon Curran also continuing as Treasurer.

With much of our older stock finally sold the group was able to purchase new items for both stalls this year and a website was established featuring all of our products to give families a better idea of what was on offer. This year we aimed at purchasing more high-quality gifts rather than junky gimmicky items, so some gifts were at a higher price point this year meaning less profit however less unsold stock.

The Mother's Day stall was held on Thursday, May 9th, and was a successfully run event where we ended up selling around 1,370 gifts which were wrapped by our lovely group of volunteers. We served close to 600 students throughout the day. Takings for the day were \$6450 less expenses of \$4540 ( cost of goods, wrapping paper, stationery, website costs, etc) leaving us with a profit of \$1,909.00.

Due to a clash with Wakakiri performances the stall for Father's Day 2019 was moved from our regular Thursday to a Tuesday in late August. This resulted in a much higher number of students requiring IOUs (43 in total compared to 18 for Mother's Day) however thankfully nearly all of them were paid for and collected the following day. The stall was a great success; we sold approximately 1,400 items on the day. Takings for the day were \$5475 less expenses of \$3566 leaving us with a profit of \$2,280. Due to volunteer fatigue with Spring Fair and Father's Day breakfast, in 2018 we used gift bags as an alternative to having volunteers wrapping gifts however the feedback from families was that they preferred the individual wrapping, so we returned to this option for 2019.

Once again with the continued experience of the committee, we feel that things ran very smoothly in 2019 and we are continuing to put processes in place to make things easier in the ensuing years or when existing members leave so that knowledge and information can be shared and passed on. We have set up running sheets, to-do lists, and weekly checklists for both stalls. The students really enjoy the stall and take great pleasure in picking out the right gifts for the special person in their lives. The group would like to extend a huge thank you to the P&C for their support and to all of the amazing parents that have helped with both events throughout the year. We had many volunteers at both stalls that came in and very patiently wrapped over 1500 presents throughout the day. These events would not be possible without the continual support of our volunteers and also the support of students, teaching staff, and families attending these events.

### TWPS Band Convener Report 2020


Unsurprisingly we had a large number of resignations over the course of the year. We assume those that have remained are pretty committed and likely to remain in band long-term.
